Dear Parents and Carers!

Going for a short walk can provide many opportunities to support your child's looking and learning.

This is a short trail along the riverside that you may do possibly several times over the coming weeks.

The photos are a guide of what you, the adult can look out for and the sort of questions you may ask the children to guide their looking.

Some of the photos encourage aspects of maths, some looking at print, some on aspects of nature.

You probably do this sort of thing all the time when you are out and about.

The trail starts at the top of the path on Stourbridge Common that you get to through the alleyway at the bottom of Wadloes Road.

When you come onto the path, the play park will be on your left and the Green Dragon Bridge will be at the opposite end. (That's the answer to question 1!)

When you reach the Green Dragon Bridge, the trail follows the path to the right, toward the railway bridge.

This is where it ends and you come back the same route.
